#### **Kevin GREENAWAY**

In December 1953, aged 15 years, I had just completed my 4<sup>th</sup> year at the Sale Technical School and was looking forward to another two years of school when my Father announced that "the Bank Manager wants to see you "

I was quite concerned with this as I had been trying to get to know his daughter. However the Bank Manager offered me a position in The Commercial Banking Company of Sydney in Sale which I accepted.

So, on 26<sup>th</sup> January 1954 I began my banking career. (Australia Day wasn't declared a National Public Holiday until 1994). Was this really 70 years ago?

My starting salary was £350 p.a. (\$700) or \$13,46 a week. and I thought I was made. (Five years before this it would have been £150 p.a or \$5.77 per wk)

Thirty-four years before that in 1920 my Father began work at 5/- (50c) a week (\$26. p.a) to help the family finances!

How times have changed. I have just checked and the average wage in Melbourne today is \$75,000. p.a (\$1442 p.wk or \$36 per hour)

Over one hundred times more than my initial salary and almost 3,000 times my Father's wage.

During my Banking career I was appointed to the Relieving Staff four times, as Junior, Teller, Accountant & Manager and also twelve branches as "Permanent?".. During my career, which ended when I resigned as the Manager of Ivanhoe Branch in 1976, I had worked in 79 different branches across Victoria & NSW and doubled up on some, making a total of 99 moves in 23 years.

Since I left the Bank I have been self employed as a part owner in a Caravan Park, Gift Shop in Brisbane, Giftware Wholesaler in Brisbane and finally as a Professional Wedding Photographer before retiring to Beachmere in 2,000

So I can say that I have NEVER actually applied for a job in my life.

# Tellers, guns and money

THE life of a banker can have its thrilling moments, not least when packing a pistol.

Kevin Greenfield, of Beachmere, who spent 23 years with the old CBC bank in Victoria and NSW, tells about the days when all bank branches kept guns.

He said every teller had to keep a loaded .38-calibre revolver under the counter, where it could be easily reached in case of a hold-up.

Kevin said he couldn't see the logic in it: if a robber was pointing a gun at him, wouldn't he be at risk reaching for his weapon too?

The bank also required

staff to be familiar with the weapons, so firing practice routinely took place.

"We would place a target on a tree in a remote place and take turns at firing the revolver.

"The target usually was quite safe as the revolvers were wildly inaccurate.

"As most tellers then were teenagers, the bank was effectively arming a lot of very young people," Kevin said.

He said that when transporting cash outside the

He was transferred several times and was attached to the relieving staff in Mel-bourne and Sydney. He moved 99 times and worked at 79 branches before he left the bank in 1976.

He said he was lucky: in all that time, not once did he experience a hold-up or have to use a gun in a real-life situation. But he probably prevented a crime the day he spotted a shifty-looking character outside the branch.

To be on the safe side, he called the police. As their car came near, the man got up and decamped. When the law caught up with him, a loaded pistol was found on his person.

Margaret POWELL Life Member Stan was known as a "great bloke" which says it all, and admired by many of his colleagues. Full details of his service are oblique but he joined in 1953 it included Sydney Office, Relief Staff, and eight years plus at St Leonards BBC where he relieved managers on numerous occasions. Stan was married to Pamela (dec'd) and is survived by his three sons.

Richard NOTT AM I was more than saddened to read of Stan's death. His brother John was in the bank and he relieved at Mullumbimby in 1957 when I was there. He later went on to become an Anglican priest and was rector at several city parishes. He came to visit me at my little shack in Mullum where he told me he was completing a Theological diploma and encouraged me to do so which I then took up and completed. The family was a dedicated Anglican one. I first worked with Stan in Manager's Department Head Office O&M survey in 1971. Stan had a bland projected but keen humour. During one meeting he was interrupted by a phone call from Lionel Gillard (then Accountant Sydney office). The tenor of the discussion went along these lines "I can usually make up my mind quickly about people Mr. Gillard, but in your case I am still thinking about it!" Later when Stan was sent into branch training, he was working with me as Accountant at Paddington branch for about six months. We had some strange customers as one would expect at that branch, and one was a scantily dressed lady of the night who came to the bank to receive a remittance from her father and Stan sent her home to get changed before he would talk with her. Stan was a keen fisherman and arranged an evening with me and Ed Bentley to go to Bobbin Head and catch jewfish and a great evening. He was later manager at Roseville but then seemed to disappear into the ether and I never ever saw him again, one of my regrets. A unique character; steady, reliable, conscientious, and a worthy citizen.
